Draft Minutes of Monthly Meeting for Business Held Eleventh Month 19, 2017

At Green Street Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends, held at 45 West School House Lane, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on Eleventh Month 19, 2017: Business Meeting convened at 12:45 PM in prayerful silence.

17-11-01 After a brief period of silent worship, the agenda was approved.

17-11-02 Interim Recording Clerk: Robert Dockhorn was appointed interim recording clerk for today's meeting.

17-11-03 Report of Head of Greene Street Friends School: Edward Marshall, Head of School, presented his annual report. The School opened with 318 students, the same number as last year, solidifying recent growth. The School has grown considerably in recent years. Students of color comprise 46% of the student body. There are 28 children of faculty and staff. The Germantown children (ZIP code 19144) number 64. Currently there are two Germantown Scholars and two Lenfest Scholars, who are on full scholarships. Otherwise, the maximum financial aid is 50% of tuition.

Ed answered questions raised at our Meeting last month. The racial makeup of students who left the school last year (Black 28%, Asian 2%, Latino 2%, Multiracial 17%, White 51%) was close to the makeup of the students that stayed. The racial makeup of workers on the building was widely varied among the different functions. For the makeup of the Board, of the 16 members there are eight women and eight men, and five people of color. For faculty salaries, we targeted the median for similar schools in our area and were within \$600.

17-11-04 Horizons: Ed introduced Lehla Olson, director of the summer Horizons Program, to give a report. This is the second summer, so we have kindergartners and 1st-graders, as we add a grade each year. It is a full day program, aimed at countering summer slide and fewer resources at home. Not just a camp. Learning centers, stations, specials, assemblies. Lehla distributed a handout describing a variety of activities and supports for students and empowering families to expect growth. The ideal is to match the achievements of GSFS students. A strong feature is the almost daily swim program. Trust is achieved with families through involvement in activities. Lehla is frequently in touch with parents on the phone. Families are brought back periodically during the other seasons of the year. The GSFS life skills program is used, providing socio-emotional learning. For instance, students come to understand that they can be excited and angry at the same time. It was noted that Wister, formerly a district school, is now a charter school, and the program has continued despite the transition.

Lehla also reported on the identity programming that occurs at Greene Street Friends during the school year. There is much work on gender and racial issues. Racial affinity groups are used, followed by coming back together with the whole community. Each week they reassess results and make course corrections.

Academically, students at Greene Street Friends test slightly above the norm, with no drilling for tests. Grammar and spelling are areas where they want to grow the program.

The Meeting thanked Ed and Lehla warmly for their presentations, with a comment that we feel fortunate to have Lehla involved, both in Horizons and as the School's learning specialist.
